CONTEXT

How is it possible that Agriculture, which the world relies on, generates so much frustrations, despair and hardship for farmers?

Farmers Dialogue is helping farmers bring solutions to this huge challenge.

It aims to reinforce the values that make farmers everywhere partners rather than competitors, to take responsibility to ensure there are adequate supplies of food in the world, to take care of the soil and of the environment in order to secure the future of generations to come.

METHOD

Meetings to share experiences and stimulate commitment and progress

Frank exchanges between farmers and consumers

Taking part in the major debates that affected world agriculture (see the farmers' charter, a declaration by farmers sent to the Director of the World Trade Organisation)

Field visits to see first hand the successes and failures in rural life and agricultural development in other parts of the world
