FARMERS' DIALOGUE - CAMEROON (DEA-C)

is pleased to invite you to the International Farmers' Dialogue being held in CAMEROON from 2nd to 9th May 2018 with the theme:

"FAMILY AGRICULTURE AS A DRIVER OF SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT"

One third of the world's population is involved in agriculture, mostly in developing countries, similar to Cameroon these farmers are mainly small family farmers or share croppers on rented agriculture land. However, in more developed countries, agriculture is generally practiced on a larger scale on both family owned farms or by multinational corporations. These multinationals control much of the seed, fertilizer, chemicals, production, research, marketing and distribution of agricultural products.

Family farming has become synonymous with vulnerability, but it can be a key to ending this cycle. Indeed, it is a proven farming system that can support sustainable life on this earth where natural resources are limited. We must also promote communication with consumers so that everyone can lead healthy lives and encourage the right kind of exchanges.

In the context of the liberalization of its national economy, Cameroon has chosen agricultural development and the rural sector as the fundamental option of its strategy for growth and employment. Agriculture therefore remains a decisive sector for its economy. It contributes more than 40% to export earnings and 41% to Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and employs 80% of the labor force. It is the major source of income for the poorest members of the population, it receives the full attention of the government and remains the main pillar of the country's food security.

Indeed, the country has many assets: wide geographical and climatic diversity allows it to grow a large number of agro-industrial crops for local consumption (corn, cassava, plantain, pineapple, macabo, rice, millet, sorghum, peanut, potato, sweet potato, green bean, soy, tomato, yam, onion, pistachio, pumpkin seeds, guava, mango, avocado, papaya, onion, etc.) and export (cocoa, coffee, cotton, natural rubber) banana, tobacco, palm oil, etc.).

Livestock and aquaculture are also an important sub-sector of the Cameroonian economy. More than 30% of the Cameroonian population is basing on it as a means of subsistence, but also a source of income and savings. We also note the capacity of this sub-sector to generate jobs: cattle traders, poultry sellers, fish sellers, transporters, butchers and delicatessens, etc.
