- d) Capacity building
- e) Farmers exchange program for learning experience.
- f) Community co-operation by forming groups/ societies especially women and young people who are mostly affected
- g) Utilization and land ownership
 The government has issued title deeds to land owners hence creating land
 security and improved food production.

On peace building and food security Ejidia Njeri said that there is need to maintain harmony between the communities where they face challenges, and this will build peace among the farmers and improve farm product.

She also informed farmers on food safety, and how to prevent food loss and food waste.
